COMMUNITY GREEN RADIO LISTENERS CLUBS IN KIBOGA AND KYANKWANZI DISTRICTS START INCOME GENERATING PROJECTS

After getting its own home in Kiboga in 2018, Community Green Radio (CGR) under the NAPE Sustainability School Programme embarked on the process of forming Listeners Clubs in Kyankwanzi and Kiboga Districts. The radio encourages listeners to put in practice what they learn on the radio.

The radio discourages idleness and urges listeners to engage in projects aimed at improving their livelihoods. As part of building the capacity of the members of the new listeners clubs, the radio arranged exchange visits between them and the listeners clubs in Kikuube and Hoima Districts that have been in place since 2014. What was learnt in those exchange visits is now being implemented by some listeners clubs.
